1. A discipline focused on precise, balanced movement and communication through a prepared test of required figures.

2. A pattern class built around controlled circles, spins, sliding stops, rollbacks, and precise transitions.

3. A fast team sport where riders use mallets to move a ball toward goal. It requires speed, balance, turning ability, and teamwork.

4. A judged class focused on the rider's position, control, pattern accuracy, and ability to guide the horse smoothly in Western tack.

5. A style that rewards a horse that looks useful, responsive, and comfortable doing everyday ranch-type work.

6. A jumping discipline scored by speed and faults. The goal is to clear the course accurately and efficiently.

7. A style often associated with high-stepping breeds and show-ring presentation, emphasizing animation and presence.

8. A timed event where horse and rider run a cloverleaf pattern around three barrels as quickly and cleanly as possible.

9. A three-phase sport that combines dressage, cross-country, and stadium jumping to test versatility and fitness.
